- Exodus 34:5-7 – the John 3:16 of the Old Testament
- “This is one of those watershed moments when everything changes. It’s one of the few places in the entire Bible where God describes himself. Where he essentially says, ‘This is what I’m like.’ Think of it as God’s self-disclosure statement, his press release to the world” (John Mark Comer, God Has a Name, p.32).
- Ex. 33:13 -- Ex. 33:19 -- Ex. 34:5-7


- John 1:1-3, 14
