## The Dividing Wall of Hostility

•	"Divisiveness is a constant characteristic of every community
	without Christ" (John Stott, Ephesians, p.96).

- Genesis 12:2-3
- "The tragedy was that Israel twisted the doctrine of election into one of favouritism, became filled with racial pride and hatred, despised Gentiles as 'dogs,' and developed traditions which kept them apart" (John Stott, Acts, p.185).
- Because of those inscriptions, that wall between the Court of the Gentiles and the rest of the Temple was referred to as "the \_\_\_\_\_ wall of hostility."
- Ephesians 2:13-16

## The Vision

- A vision made to offend...
- "Surely not, Lord!"
- "The voice spoke to him a second time, 'Do not call anything impure that God has made clean'" (Acts 10:15).
- *Katharizo* to clean, cleanse, or purify

•	It seems that here, the Lord was trying to undo in Peter the idea that there are humans.
	The Waiting World
•	Do not hesitate to and the human being
	in front of you.
•	1 Timothy 2:3-6
•	Do we think of some people as impure or unclean?
•	Are there groups or categories of people you place – maybe
	even unknowingly – beyond the sphere of God's love?
•	Who are "those" people for you?
•	You should not consider any other human being
	or unclean.
