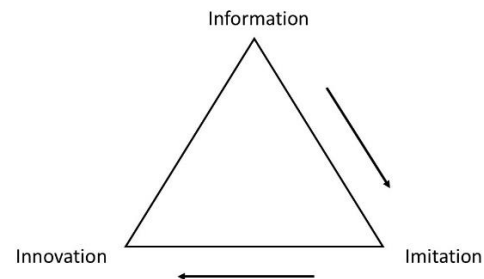

- Following the Way of Jesus
  - Step One – \_\_\_\_\_ from your covenant identity.
  - Step Two – \_\_\_\_\_ in your kingdom authority.
  - Step Three – \_\_\_\_\_ and invest in people of peace.
  - Step Four – \_\_\_\_\_ spiritual family on mission.

#### **Friend to Follower**

- *Oikos* – “a multi-generational extended family of both blood and non-blood relatives who share life and a family business together in a family compound” (Bob Rognlien, The Jesus-Shaped Way, p.77-78).
- Luke 5:4-5
- This is the friend to \_\_\_\_\_ test to determine whether Peter was ready to be a disciple.
- “Disciples of Jesus are people who do not just profess certain views as their own but apply their growing understanding of life in the Kingdom of the Heavens to every aspect of their life on earth” (Dallas Willard, The Great Omission, p. xi).
- When we do what Jesus says, there’s lots of \_\_\_\_\_.

#### **Drop Out to Disciple**

- Mark 1:17
- Hebrew education system...
- Jesus calls all of us \_\_\_\_\_ that with his help, we can become like him.
- Invited into the God’s family business.

#### **Eager to Competent**

- “Disciple” was replaced with the idea of “spiritual \_\_\_\_\_.”
- 1 Corinthians 4:14-16
- Paidagōgous – instructor, \_\_\_\_\_, guardian
- Notice the distinction he makes between information and \_\_\_\_\_.

- Jesus invited his disciples \_\_\_\_\_ his life, and they moved into his oikos.
- Jesus’ Training Model:
  - Stage 1 – Unconscious Incompetence / I do, you watch
  - Stage 2 – \_\_\_\_\_ Incompetence / I do, you help
  - Stage 3 – Conscious Competence / You do, I help
  - Stage 4 – Unconscious Competence / You do, I watch
- Following the Way of Jesus
  - Step Five – \_\_\_\_\_ others spiritually so they can serve as spiritual parents (disciples making disciples)

#### **Reflection Questions**

1. Where in your life have you faced a decision like Simon, where you could do either what you thought best or what Jesus said to do? What did you learn from that experience?
2. How does that fact that Jesus is calling you to follow him and believes that you, with his help, can become like him, encourage your faith? How does it challenge your faith?
3. Where in your life (doesn’t have to be spiritual) do you feel that you’ve moved from a place of unconscious incompetence to unconscious competence through a process of development as described above? Tell the group about that experience.
4. What did you find most helpful/challenging in this message?
5. How is God getting your attention?
6. What might God be saying to you?
7. What is your next faithful step?
